

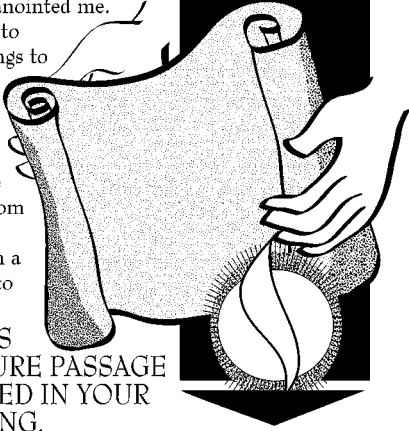
Body And Soul

We have moved into a much more complex and holistic understanding of illness and wellness. We simply understand more than we ever have about the intimate interconnection of our body parts and organ systems. Emotions are now known to be stored in the body. Physicists confirm that all life is based upon cells vibrating at different frequencies. These vibrations communicate between all parts of the body. Every part has freedom to play its role, but the person taken as a whole is greater than the sum of their parts. St. Paul uses the same model for the spiritual body of Christ. No person's gift can be left out, and each part of the body is essential for the whole body to be healthy. In fact, the freedom of Christ is increased when we play our God-given roles and allow others to play theirs. This is important because we, as Christ's Church, are called to be free and to be the bringers of freedom to others. There is so much slavery in our world, especially narrow and limited views of life which exclude other people because of race, skin color, age, or gender. As Christ's agent of freedom we are to be liberators for others, not oppressors. The founders of Alcoholics Anonymous could have gone their merry way after finding freedom from alcohol. But they wanted to give their gift of freedom to others. This is a faint reflection of the story of the Church. Jesus came to liberate all of us. He is the Way to freedom, forgiveness, love, understanding and compassion. Then he sent us out to bring the Way to the rest of the world. And that is still our task....called out of a limited death-dealing vision of life, to a vision of life that proclaims love for all, and new and risen life for all. What part of Christ's Body are you? Knowing Christ is to know our role in his Way. **Go rejoicing to love and serve our God!**

Catholic Relief Services to Haiti

Millions of people have been affected by the earthquake in Haiti and are in need of shelter and food. Most of all, they need to find their loved ones who have gone missing in this disaster.

Give and the Canadian government will match the amount of your individual donation.

Development and Peace and Caritas Internationalis, the international emergency relief network of the Catholic Church, are focusing all their efforts on delivering immediate assistance to the people of Haiti who are in dire need. Development and Peace is sending two of its emergency staff members to Haiti to join the Caritas relief mission already underway there.

"Our partners on the ground are exhausted. Many of them have lost close ones and are dealing with this on a very personal level. We want to be there to lend a hand and begin the important task in laying the foundation for our work in assisting to rebuild lives, livelihoods and communities in the stricken country," said Michael Casey, Executive Director of Development and Peace.

Both Danielle Leblanc and André Charlebois have extensive experience in emergency response situations and their expertise will be a valuable asset to the Caritas team. The following actions are currently being carried out by the team on the ground there:

- Purchase food in the Dominican Republic and assemble 50,000 boxes that will be delivered to Port-au-Prince;
- Distribute water storage containers and water purification tablets to 2,000 families;
- Provide plastic sheeting, mosquito nets and hygiene kits to 500 families .

Your contribution will allow us to do more and continue helping the victims of this disaster. Million of people currently need shelter and food. They need safety and to find their loved ones who have gone missing in this disaster. Please join us as Canadians in responding to this crisis and help us
