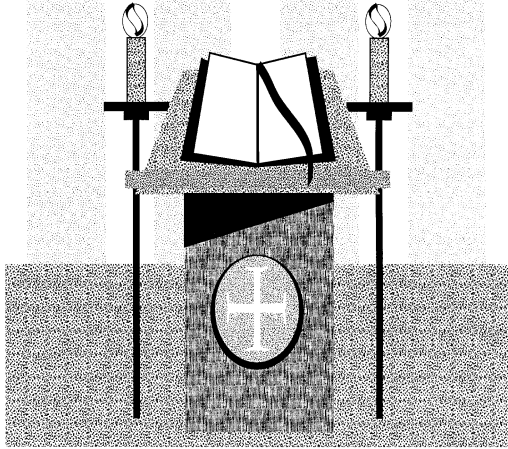

If we become "everyday prophets," making God's work our first investment, Psalm 85 says "The Lord Himself shall give his benefits: "Kindness and truth shall meet; Justice and peace shall kiss. Truth shall spring out of the earth, And justice shall look down from heaven." Go in peace, to love and serve our God!
